Of her fundraising challenge, Nicky said: "I want to raise awareness of the problems people with disabilities can face – not in coping with their disability, but with infrastructure restrictions and society's prejudices. I support Leonard Cheshire Disability because of their work to campaign for change in these areas."

13:24 Wednesday 11th November was the moment Ian started looking to the future again. It started when his world turned upside down following a medical negligence case that resulted in the devastating loss of his left leg.

After five years of exhausting legal battles, Sita Soni from Boyes Turner reached a settlement; resulting in Ian visiting The London Prosthetic Centre. Here, the dedicated team led by Abdo Haidar, began to help Ian put his life back on track, from recommending the most suitable prosthesis for his lifestyle, to providing the utmost care and attention at each visit. The Worshipful Company of Glover of London help fund Charlotte Hannibal – meningitis survivor

Charlotte Hannibal, 19, from Selston, Nottinghamshire, contracted meningitis that led to amputation of both legs below the knee, as well as the fingers on her left hand, in a bid to save her life. A year later, despite her life changing dramatically, Miss Hannibal is optimistic about life and claims she has cheated death. Speaking today, she said: 'I feel incredibly lucky. I'm still alive, and although I've lost both my lower legs and fingers, some people have lost a lot more.' (*Snippet from Daily Mail newspaper*)

The Amputation Rehabilitation Services in Nottingham approached The London Prosthetic Centre to produce a custom high definition silicone hand that has been funded by The Worshipful Company of Glovers. Adlerman Alison Gowman and, David Stone, members of the Glovers Charitable Trust Board, together with Charlotte and her family visited the centre to see the detailed process of producing a prosthetic and to take a sneak peek to see the almost finished hand, which will be delivered to Charlotte next week. The Worshipful Company of Glovers Charity will offer after care and maintenance for the next five years. A heartfelt thank you to the Company for their generous donation that has made this possible.

Charlotte is now an ambassador for Meningitis Research Foundation and is helping to educate younger people on the importance of vaccination against meningitis by sharing her near fatal experience. Starting in August this year, all 17 - 18-year-olds and first year university students in the UK are being offered a free vaccine which protects against meningococcal A, C, W and Y bacteria.

Chloe Monroe - Car accident tragedy to surfer girl!

14-year-old Chloe Monroe lost her dominant left arm below the elbow in a horrific utility vehicle accident in 2015. Her younger sister was with her at the time and was fortunate that she sustained no injuries. After 6 operations, it was confirmed that Chloe's arm could not be saved.

Chloe, a Beauty Queen and high school dancer, has not been deterred by losing her arm, with her mum saying that Chloe's positive attitude has touched the hearts of her community so much so, that they held a fundraiser event to help with costs for a new prostheses. Chloe is re-learning how to write with her right hand and says with a smile, 'Some things are hard, harder than others, but I try to do everything that I can and sometimes I fail.' Her mother Jennifer explains, 'I think the word that comes to mind is resilient. She has really shown great stride in being positive.'

Chloe is one of only 20 girls across the USA recently chosen to attend the annual, 'Beautifully Flawed Retreat'. The retreat is hosted by friends of Bethany Hamilton, the surfer who lost her arm in a shark attack. The non-profit organisation reaches out to encourage hope to young girls who have lost at least one limb.

The London Prosthetic Centre was selected to help build and create Chloe's new arm as both her and her mother travelled from Tennessee, USA to meet with Abdo and his team to create a high definition silicone hand and arm. The cast and colour matches were taken to create a high definition silicone arm. Upon receiving her new socket that Abdo had made, Chloe shared her joy in terms of how well it fit and most importantly, how comfortable it was.

The finished arm will soon be shipped to Chloe and we look forward to seeing pictures of the fit! We are thrilled to have met such an inspirational and exceptional young lady and to be able to help Chloe embark upon her new journey in life. To find out more visit, <http://bit.ly/297NHLy>
